3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

- A. Jennifer Abbey, United States Department of Agriculture-Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS)
 - **❖ Farm Bill Programs:** 27 of 60 Active contracts totaling approximately \$1,200,000 over approximately 11,500 acres
 - **❖ Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP):** 15 Active Contracts | 18 2025 Applications | 1 2025 Emergency Application (high tunnel)
 - **❖ Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)**: 12 Active Contracts | 1 renewal application, preapproved | 15 2025 Applications
 - **❖** Agricultural Conservation Easement Program Wetland Reserve Easements (ACEP WRE): 2025 Application Deadline Oct 4 and Dec. 20

 - ❖ Other: CSP annual Payments. Continued site visits to EQIP and CSP applicants for 2025. Assessed and ranked CSP renewal applications (3 total). All staff attended NRCS annual operations meeting in Ft. Pierce.

- Next Month: Continue conservation implementation field inspections as needed. Continue site visits to EQIP and CSP applicants.
- Site visit: Saturday, December 7, 2024 to a local Oyster Farm with floating cages. USDA-NRCS asked to meet with farmer under the Emergency EQIP Program due to recent hurricanes. Advertising new conservation funding for Bivalve Aquaculture Gear and Biofouling Control for shellfish, i.e. oysters, clams' environmental recovery effort. Actions that reduce, clean, or remove biofouling organisms and other waste from bivalve production area while minimizing environmental risk and risk to species of concern. Reduce adverse impacts of shellfish aquaculture operations and gear on water, plant, animal, and human resources. Improve dependable water quantity and quality to support shellfish production. Improve adequate food quantity and quality to support shellfish production.

B. Andrea Lazzari, Indian River County (IRC) Agricultural Extension Director/ University of Florida/Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF IFAS) Report:

- Submitted Annual reports on Friday, December 6, 2024. Planning programs for 2025.
- Site visit to Morning Star Fields: Water and Soil samples taken for a baseline prior to production. Sent to a private laboratory in Georgia to test for nutrients and coliform counts per Andrea's recommendations.

C. Matthew Cox, Environmental Specialist III, Office of Agricultural Water Policy-Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (OAWP-FDACS) Report:

❖ Sod Manual is now available online. Topics: Agricultural Best Management Practices, IV Site Visit, How to enroll in BMP Program, BMP Rules, Manuals, and Brochures, BMP Cost-Share Program are all now online at the FDACS' Office of Agriculture Water Policy website.

Dr. David L. Cox mentioned that the Florida Medical Entomology Laboratory (FMEL), located on Oslo Road may want to have an arbovirus sentinel station near the Morning Star Fields property. FMEL may report to the Florida Department of Health regarding Florida Arbovirus Surveillance.

Chairman Robert C. Adair, Jr. will reach out to Jonathan Day, Emeritus Professor UF-FMEL.

D. Stephen Wright, Environmental Specialist II, Office of Agricultural Water Policy-Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (OAWP-FDACS) Report:

- ❖ Florida Administrative Code 5M-1 Purposes
 - To prevent duplicate regulation. What programs can substitute for FDACS BMPs?
 - To consolidate rules common to the various FDACS Best Management Practices Program manuals into a single chapter.
 - To adopt language allowing enrollees in the FDACS Best Management Practices Program to apply replacement fertilizer if impacted by an emergency event that results in an unmarketable, destroyed, or flooded crop.

E. Eric Charest, Indian River County Assistant Natural Resources Director:

❖ Continuing to work with the State of Florida on the differences between total nitrogen and nitrate nitrogen regarding their modeling effort. How you can use a program that gives you a nitrate loading, but the State is not converting to total nitrogen for the BMAP. The revised modeling effort is almost two years late to show the County what our allocations and targeted goals are.

Need approximately \$8,000. and could be cleaned up within 3 days after permit. He possibly could look into grant assistance to assist him to keep his farm productive.
